## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGAL REPRESENTATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 334-126, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 3 "(f) The court may appoint an attorney for the subject if
- 4 the court determines that the interests of justice require one
- 5 be appointed. If the subject of the petition is represented by
- 6 [their own] an attorney, whether retained by the subject or
- 7 appointed by the court, the attorney shall be allowed adequate
- $oldsymbol{8}$  time for investigation of the matters at issue and for
- 9 preparation, and shall be permitted to present the evidence that
- 10 the attorney believes necessary for a proper disposition of the
- 11 proceeding."
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 802-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) Any indigent person who is:
- 15 (1) Arrested for, charged with, or convicted of an offense
- or offenses punishable by confinement in jail or

1		prison or for which the person may be or is subject to
2		the provisions of chapter 571;
3	(2)	Threatened by confinement, against the indigent
4		person's will, in any psychiatric or other mental
5		institution or facility;
6	[ <del>(3)</del>	The subject of a petition for assisted community
7		treatment under chapter 334;] or
8	[ <del>(4)</del> ]	(3) The subject of a petition for involuntary medical
9		treatment under chapter 353,
10	shall be	entitled to be represented by a public defender. If,
11	however,	conflicting interests exist, or if the public defender
12	for any o	ther reason is unable to act, or if the interests of
13	justice r	equire, the court may appoint other counsel."

Public Defender; Hawaii Paroling Authority; Legal Representation

## Description:

Allows a court to appoint an attorney for the subject of a petition for assisted community treatment if the interests of justice require one be appointed. Repeals paragraph (3) of section 802-1(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, which entitles the subject of a petition for assisted community treatment to legal representation by a public defender. (SD1)
