A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEAD POISONING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§32</u>	1- Lead poisoning; testing; minors; exemption. (a)	
5	Beginning	January 1, 2025, a physician treating a minor patient	
6	shall complete the following:		
7	(1)	Test the minor patient for lead poisoning, or order	
8		the test for the minor patient at certain intervals	
9		using methods pursuant to recommendations adopted by	
10		the department of health; and	
11	(2)	If the physician performs the test described in	
12		paragraph (1), the physician shall make an entry of	
13		the testing on the minor patient's record.	
14	(b)	The department of health shall adopt recommendations	
15	to implem	ent this section. The recommendations shall include	
16	but not b	e limited to:	

1	<u>(1)</u>	Subject to subsection (c), a recommendation that a
2		minor residing in the State shall be considered at
3		high risk for lead exposure and tested according to
4		the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and
5		Treatment guidelines for children enrolled in
6		medicaid; and
7	(2)	Procedures for entering the information described in
8		subsection (a)(2) on the minor's record of testing,
9		including but not limited to procedures for entering
10		the information if testing is performed by a person
11		other than a physician.
12	<u>(c)</u>	The department of health may adjust the recommendation
13	in subsec	tion (b)(1) if, after collecting and reviewing data on
14	lead poisoning in the State for five years, the department of	
15	health determines that testing minors at the ages set by	
16	subsection (b)(1) is no longer necessary or appropriate to	
17	maintain the health and safety of minors who reside in the	
18	State. If the department of health adjusts the recommendations	
19	in subsection (b)(1) pursuant to this section, the department of	
20	health sh	all submit a report of its findings and rationale to

- 1 the legislature twenty days prior to the convening of the next
- 2 regular session.
- 3 (d) This section shall not apply to a minor whose parent,
- 4 guardian, or individual in loco parentis objects to testing."

- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

DOH; Minors; Lead Poisoning; Mandatory Testing; Requirements; Rules; Exemption

Description:

Beginning 1/1/2025, requires physicians to perform or order test for lead poisoning in minor patients at certain intervals, and if the physician performs the test, the results to be included in the minor patient's record of immunization. Requires the Department of Health to adopt recommendations. Provides certain exemptions for the mandatory lead poisoning testing of minors. (SD1)

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
