# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNLICENSED CONTRACTORS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the August 2023
- 2 wildfires on Maui caused significant property loss, including
- 3 the destruction of Lahaina town. In connection with those
- 4 property losses, former Lahaina homeowners and business owners
- 5 will be seeking building and repair services for damaged and
- 6 destroyed property, and some may receive offers to perform these
- 7 services from persons without the appropriate licensure required
- 8 by state law.
- 9 The legislature further finds that work performed by
- 10 unlicensed contractors unfairly exposes Hawaii property owners
- 11 to liability for poor workmanship and jobsite injuries and
- 12 increases the likelihood of unlicensed contractor fraud in which
- 13 an unlicensed contractor obtains payment and provides no work or
- 14 incomplete work. The legislature finds that to prevent these
- 15 harms from occurring during the repairs and new construction in
- 16 connection with the August 2023 Maui wildfires, or any future
- 17 natural disasters, it is necessary to provide enhanced civil and



- 1 criminal penalties for violating Hawaii's contractor licensing2 law.
- 3 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 4 (1) Make it unlawful for an unlicensed contractor to offer
  5 or perform repairs or improvements to a residential or
  6 nonresidential structure or property, or add to or
  7 subtract from grounds in connection with the structure
  8 or property, for damage or destruction caused by a
  9 natural disaster for which a state of emergency or
  10 disaster is proclaimed by the governor; and
- 12 Require violations to be punished by a fine of not

  12 more than \$10,000, imprisonment up to one year, or

  13 both, in addition to all other remedies or penalties.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 444-10.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
- "(e) Any person who violates section 444-9, in connection
  with the offer or performance of repairs or improvements to a
  residential or nonresidential structure or property, or by
  adding to or subtracting from grounds in connection with the
  structure or property, for damage or destruction caused by a
  natural disaster [in a political subdivision] for which a state

- 1 of emergency or disaster is proclaimed by the governor, [may]
- 2 shall be punished by a fine of [up to] not more than \$10,000,
- 3 imprisonment up to one year, or both, in addition to all other
- 4 remedies or penalties."
- 5 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

# S.B. NO. 2977

### Report Title:

Unlicensed Contractors; State of Emergency; Penalties

#### Description:

Makes it unlawful for an unlicensed contractor to offer or perform repairs or improvements to a residential or nonresidential structure or property, or add to or subtract from grounds in connection with the structure or property, for damage or destruction caused by a natural disaster for which a state of emergency or disaster is proclaimed by the Governor. Requires violations to be punished by a fine of not more than \$10,000, imprisonment up to one year, or both, in addition to all other remedies or penalties.

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
