A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that over the past five
- 2 years, the transportation network company industry has
- 3 experienced substantial growth nationally and in Hawaii,
- 4 transforming the way people commute and navigate. This paradigm
- 5 shift is evident in cities like Boston, where the gross revenues
- 6 generated by transportation network company rides reached a
- 7 staggering \$45,000,000 in 2022 alone. As transportation network
- 8 companies continue to grow, their impact is increasingly felt in
- 9 Hawaii's communities and on its roads. In Hawaii, a state
- 10 heavily reliant on tourism, transportation network company
- 11 services are often utilized by visitors. The legislature
- 12 further finds that visitors and transportation network company
- 13 platforms should contribute more to ensure the safety of
- 14 children biking, walking, or rolling to school.
- 15 The legislature further finds that implementing a fee has
- 16 been successful for funding infrastructure in other states like
- 17 Minnesota. Hawaii has the potential to create a self-sustaining

- 1 source of funding for the State's safe routes to schools
- 2 program. This approach not only aligns with broader initiatives
- 3 to promote responsible tourism, but also represents a
- 4 responsible means of addressing the safety issues that are
- 5 exacerbated by the proliferation of transportation network
- 6 company services in the State.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to implement a fee on each
- 8 transportation network company ride, to be used on safety
- 9 projects.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 279G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- "§279G- Transportation network company fee. (a) There
- 14 is levied and shall be assessed and collected a transportation
- 15 network company fee of cents on each ride originated
- 16 through a transportation network company's digital platform.
- 17 The transportation network company fee shall be levied upon the
- 18 rider.
- 19 (b) Each transportation network company shall collect and
- 20 remit the required transportation network company fees to the
- 21 department of taxation.

1 (c) All fees collected under this section shall be 2 deposited into the safe routes to schools program special fund 3 established under section 291C-4. 4 (d) For the purposes of this section, "transportation 5 network company" means the same as in section 431:10C-701." 6 SECTION 3. Section 291C-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended to read as follows: 8 "§291C-4 Safe routes to school program special fund; 9 establishment. There is established in the state treasury the 10 safe routes to school program special fund, into which shall be 11 deposited: 12 (1) Assessments collected for speeding in a school zone, 13 pursuant to section 291C-104; [and] 14 (2) Safe routes to school program surcharges collected in 15 accordance with sections 291-16 and 291C-5[\div]; and 16 (3) Transportation network company fees collected in 17 accordance with section 279G- ." 18 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
