A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY AEROMEDICAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that most rural
2	communities have fewer healthcare resources compared to
3	residents on Oahu, including access to advanced levels of trauma
4	care, medical specialists, and sub-specialists. This puts
5	patients in these underserved areas at greater risk of poor
6	outcomes for serious medical conditions such as heart attack,
7	stroke, and traumatic bodily injury.
8	The existing system of interisland transport of patients
9	for healthcare services is overburdened. The State is currently
10	served by only one interisland aeromedical provider, for which
11	there are few viable and cost-effective alternatives in the
12	event of a grounding, for example, due to maintenance issues or
13	crew availability. Emergency aeromedical services are not
14	available for many patients in rural counties.
15	Therefore, the legislature further finds that such
16	disruptions to interisland medical transports pose a risk to
17	human health and safety, and that the consistent availability of

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- 1 interisland medical transport and the overall resiliency of
- 2 emergency aeromedical services must be improved.
- 3 One model may be based on the county of Maui's medevac
- 4 service. Act 213, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, appropriated
- 5 general funds for the purchase of a helicopter for the county of
- 6 Maui emergency aeromedical services program, established in
- 7 2003, which is currently equipped with a twin-engine helicopter
- 8 capable of medical transport between Maui and Oahu. The
- 9 department of health cost shares the helicopter with the county
- 10 of Maui. The department bills for services and private sector
- 11 entities are contracted to provide the pilots, aircraft
- 12 maintenance technicians, and the medical flight staff.
- 13 The legislature finds that reliable aeromedical transport
- 14 is essential. The Maui model is suitable to meet the needs of
- 15 the State.
- 16 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to ensure the
- 17 availability of air ambulance services through an emergency
- 18 aeromedical services program with the department of health and
- 19 in cooperation with rural counties.
- 20 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended by adding to part XVIII a new section to be
- 22 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

1	" <u>§32</u>	State emergency aeromedical services partnership
2	program;	established. (a) The department shall establish,
3	administe	r, and maintain, in cooperation with each county in the
4	state eme	rgency medical services system service area, an
5	emergency	aeromedical services partnership program. The
6	departmen	t shall consult with the advisory committee pursuant to
7	section 3	21-225 to implement this section.
8	(b)	The department shall enter into a memorandum of
9	agreement	with the county of Kauai, the county of Maui, and the
10	county of	Hawaii to implement and maintain an emergency
11	aeromedic	al services partnership program. At a minimum, each
12	memorandu	m of agreement shall define responsibilities as
13	follows:	
14	(1)	The department shall provide funds for the provision
15		and maintenance of the rotary-wing aircraft;
16	(2)	The counties shall provide funds for the operations of
17		the rotary-wing aircraft, including flight crew and
18		medical staff; and
19	(3)	The State and counties shall identify and document
20		applicable federal regulations and jurisdictions, and
21		shall amend the memorandum of agreement as necessary.

1 (c) The county of Kauai, the county of Maui, and the 2 county of Hawaii shall submit to the department all necessary 3 information for purposes of submitting claims for third-party 4 reimbursement within thirty days of the service for any 5 emergency aeromedical services provided. Funds received from 6 reimbursements shall be deposited into the emergency medical 7 services special fund, pursuant to section 321-234. 8 (d) The department shall establish statewide standards for 9 the emergency aeromedical services partnership program 10 consistent with this part and applicable federal regulations for 11 those services. The director of health may adopt rules pursuant to 12 13 chapter 91 to effectuate the purposes of this section. 14 (f) No later than January 4, 2026, the department shall 15 adopt interim rules, which shall be exempt from chapter 91 and 16 chapter 201M, to effectuate the purposes of this section; 17 provided that the interim rules shall remain in effect until 18 July 1, 2028, or until rules are adopted pursuant to subsection 19 (e), whichever occurs sooner. **20** The department may amend the interim rules, and the 21 amendments shall be exempt from chapters 91 and 201M, to 22 effectuate the purposes of this chapter; provided that any

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1 amended interim rules shall remain in effect until July 1, 2028, 2 or until rules are adopted pursuant to subsection (e), whichever 3 occurs sooner." 4 SECTION 3. Section 321-232, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 6 The department shall establish reasonable fees for 7 services rendered to the public within the service area by the department, any county within the service area, or private 8 9 agency under this part; provided that all revenues collected by 10 the department and the respective counties pursuant to this 11 section shall be deposited into the state general fund, except 12 [amounts]: 13 (1) Amounts necessary to provide for collection services 14 for bad debt accounts [-]; and 15 (2) Revenues collected for emergency aeromedical services pursuant to section 321-234(c). 16 **17** Fees required to be set by this section shall be established in 18 accordance with chapter 91." SECTION 4. Section 321-234, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows: 20 21 The moneys in the special fund shall be distributed "(b) 22 as follows:

1	(1)	Beginning with fiscal year 2021-2022, \$3,500,000 shall
2		be distributed each fiscal year to a county operating
3		a county emergency medical services system pursuant to
4		part XI of chapter 46 for the operation of that
5		system; [and]
6	(2)	The remainder shall be distributed to the department
7		for operating the system established pursuant to this
8		chapter, including enhanced and expanded services, and
9		shall not be used to supplant funding for emergency
10		medical services authorized prior to July 1, 2004[-];
11		and
12	(3)	Each quarter, the deposits from reimbursements for
13		emergency aeromedical services for the previous
14		quarter shall be disbursed to the counties in the
15		service area as follows:
16		(A) Fifty per cent divided equally; and
17		(B) Fifty per cent divided proportionately based on
18		the billed amount submitted by each county.
19	(c)	Fees remitted pursuant to section 249-31, cigarette
20	tax reven	ues designated under section 245-15, interest and
21	investmen	t earnings attributable to the moneys in the special
22	fund, leg	islative appropriations, and grants, donations, [and]

1	contributions from private or public sources for the purposes of
2	the fund, and revenues collected for emergency aeromedical
3	services, shall be deposited into the special fund."
4	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
5	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$18,000,000 or so
6	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
7	deposited into the emergency medical services special fund.
8	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the emergency
9	medical services special fund the sum of \$18,000,000 or so much
10	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the
11	establishment of the emergency aeromedical services partnership
12	program.
13	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
14	health for the purposes of this Act.
15	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 8. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect
18	on July 1, 2024.

Report Title:

Emergency Aeromedical Services Partnership Program; Established; DOH; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes an Emergency Aeromedical Services Partnership Program to be administered by the Department of Health in counties with a population less than 500,000. Requires costsharing for program operations and maintenance and revenue sharing between the State and the County of Hawaii, the County of Kauai, and the County of Maui. Authorizes deposits into the Emergency Medical Services Special Fund. Requires rulemaking.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Health

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EMERGENCY

AEROMEDICAL SERVICES.

PURPOSE: To establish an emergency aeromedical

services program within the Department of

Health to ensure greater access to

aeromedical transport for patients; require a memorandum of agreement between the State and the County of Kauai, the County of Maui, and the County of Hawaii to implement and maintain the program; and share revenues from reimbursement with participating

counties.

MEANS: Add a new section to part XVIII of chapter

321, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), amend section 321-232(a), HRS, and amend section

321-234(b) and (c), HRS.

JUSTIFICATION: Most rural communities have fewer healthcare

resources compared to residents on Oahu, including the advanced levels of trauma care, medical specialists, and subspecialists. This is aggravated by inadequate access to affordable and immediate interisland medical transport due to the lack of emergency aeromedical

services providers based in the County of Kauai and the County of Hawaii. A service similar to the partnership between the State and the County of Maui to provide emergency aeromedical services that supplements

existing services provided by the private

sector will improve access.

Impact on the public: This bill will provide improved access to medical care for serious conditions such as heart attack, stroke, traumatic bodily injury, and other conditions for which local health care providers are unable to sufficiently treat due to remote location or inadequate medical resources.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
The Department of Health is required to
promulgate administrative rules to establish
standards for the emergency aeromedical
services partnership program. The County of
Kauai, the County of Maui, and the County of
Hawaii are required to provide funds for
operations, including flight crew and
medical staff.
