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<u>SB 2039</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE RENTAL INDUSTRY. Repeals vehicle license recovery fees. Takes effect 1/1/2025.	TCA, CPN
<u>SB 2680</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE RENTAL FEES. Prohibits the charging of a fee for a lessee's spouse by a lessor under certain conditions.	TCA, CPN
<u>SB 2355</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO VEHICLE TITLES. Allows a letter of attestation to the Director of Finance to act as an endorsed certificate for motor vehicle transfer.	TCA, JDC

<u>SB 2348</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PHOTO RED LIGHT IMAGING DETECTOR SYSTEMS. Provides that any photo red light imaging detector system's clear and unobstructed recorded image of a motor vehicle license plate shall be prima facie evidence that the motor vehicle to which the license plate is attached is the motor vehicle for which the license plate was issued. Requires the State, the county, or the State's or county's third party contractor to implement a process to record the date on which the summons or citation was submitted to the post office, which shall be prima facie evidence of the date the summons or citation was submitted to the post office.	TCA, JDC
<u>SB 2806</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO VEHICLES. Allows all-terrain vehicle to drive on streets with posted speed limits of not more than 45 miles per hour. Allows all-terrain vehicles to drive in the evening and night if they are equipped with headlights and tail lights. Allows drivers of all-terrain vehicles to wear a safety helmet with a securely fastened chin strap. Includes in the definition of "utility-terrain vehicle" a motor vehicle that accommodates one driver and one passenger sitting side-by-side, and up to 6 people in seat belts.	TCA, JDC
<u>SB 2630</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PEDESTRIANS. Authorizes pedestrians to act contrary to the statewide traffic code when a reasonably careful pedestrian would determine that there is no immediate danger of a collision with a moving vehicle.	TCA, JDC
<u>SB 2097</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIERS. Repeals the regulation of motor carriers by the Public Utilities Commission. Makes conforming amendments.	TCA, CPN
<u>SB 2742</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION. Establishes the greener highway corridors pilot project to improve the H-1 freeway corridor with greenery. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.	TCA, WAM
<u>SB 3069</u> Status & Testimony	MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND FINANCE. Makes an emergency appropriation to provide special funds for disbursements of moneys in the Mass Transit Special Fund.	TCA, WAM
<u>SB 2314</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO DIGITAL IDENTIFICATION. Requires the Director of Transportation to establish and implement a Digital Identification Pilot Program. In coordination with the counties and various agencies, requires the Director of Transportation to submit a report to the Legislature.	TCA, JDC/WAM
